The volunteer initially learns work processes and tasks in different departments. She/he will then be trained under consideration of interests and skills for several months in one of the areas In particular, it is planned to involve the volunteer in the ICJA project "SAWA" aiming at the inclusion of refugees living in Berlin by offering them voluntary service opportunities. In this and other projects of ICJA, the volunteer will have the task to support the organization of a variety of events and activities in the field of political and cultural education. S/he will also have the task to support the pedagogical work with international and German volunteers for example in the international seminars organized by the ICJA "Incoming Department" and "Sending Department" and to assist with organizational tasks related to these and other seminars and Description of the tasks of the volunteer meetings. in the project In addition the volunteer gets an insight into documentation and organizational tasks for all programs of ICJA. This includes development and maintenance of project blogs and documentation for EU projects such as the Erasmus+ Project series "Young Activists for Peace" and the AMIF project "Involve". Activities might also include the creation of photo logs, entering of content, design of blogs, writing and translating short texts and programs. In order to allow the volunteer to acquire skills for his/her tasks in seminars and international meetings s/he will be invited to participate in training seminars dealing with group dynamics and self-organization, intercultural communication, dealing with conflicts, contents of specific seminars, teamwork as well as technical-organizational tasks. Working hours, working time:

Training and support for the volunteer	There is a mentor who is responsible for answering any questions and supervising the work of the volunteer, and who speaks English. The volunteer can take part in the regular capacity training for staff members.  ICJA has vast experience with German and international volunteers and has been a host project for the European Voluntary Service/now European Solidarity Corps for many years.  The volunteer will never work alone, and will never have the sole responsibility for a group of children or young people.
Pocket Money	The volunteer will receive 5 Euro/day as pocket money in monthly payments (paid by ICJA).
Public Transport	The volunteer will be reimbursed for the costs of a monthly public transport ticket (reduced fee) (paid by ICJA)
Description of the accommodation	The volunteer is going to live in a host family or in a shared apartment in Berlin.
How will the food arrangement be?	The volunteer will receive a food allowance (amounting to 251Euro/month)
International travel costs	The volunteer will receive a financial contribution to his/her travel costs from his/her place of origin to Germany and back. The amount depends on the distance travelled. For travel distances between 500 km and 1999 km: 275 Euro, between 2000 km and 2999 km: 360 Euro etc.
Insurance	The volunteer will receive health insurance, third party liability insurance as well as general accident insurance via the group insurance of the European Commission (free of charge for the volunteer).

The volunteering activities in the project "Solidarity Action for Inclusion" are co-funded by the European Union Programme "European Solidarity Corps". Due to its guidelines,

- Candidates who have formerly participated in the "European Solidarity Corps", or the "European Voluntary Service" programme are not eligible for participating in this project.
- Candidates who, because of their economic, social or cultural background have less chance of participating in a transnational voluntary service programme, will be given preference.
